6. Pineville District letter read and received and delegates to bear same as follows: Eld. G. W. Maynard and Bros. Abraham Phillips and John Yates, Sr. Letter in hand of G. W. Maynard.

7. Letter to Bethlehem association read, received and delegates to bear same as follows: Elders W. B. Estep and A. L. Dempsey. Letter in hand of A. L. Dempsey.

Brethren Ira L. Farley and James Hensley were appointed finance committee who reported twelve dollars and five cents (\$12.05) received. Committee discharged.

Order that Bro. Clerk superintend the printing of our minute and distributing of same and that he have six hundred minutes printed this year.

Moved, That Bro. Clerk be appointed secretary and treasurer.

Ordered that our present treasurer go and settle with old treasurer and get the record and also what money that was left in hands of old treasurer last year.

Moved, That the amount of money left in hands of old treasurer last year be divided equally between moderator and clerk.

Brethren who were appointed in union meetings and associations made their reports satisfactorily, which reports were received.

It is ordered that our next association be held with the Brushy Fork church, Pike County, Kentucky, beginning on Friday before the third Saturday in September 1901.

It is ordered that Elder W. B. Estep preach the introductory sermon and Elder A. L. Dempsey be his alternate in case of absence.

The committee on ministry reports for stand preaching on Sunday as follows: first, Wm. H. Blankenship; second, J. E. Hensley; third, J. W. Smith; fourth, W. B. Estep.

It is ordered that our constitution and articles of faith be annexed in these minutes this year.

We, the Sardis Association, do tender our thanks to the brethren of Little Dove Church and the citizens of this vicinity for their kind entertainment and good treatment toward all the brethren during this association.

Moved that we adjourn to the time and place above mentioned.
